Dear friends

I've been noticing lately the number of times I use the word 'hope'. My messages and emails are full of it! 'Hope you're well?' 'I hope you have a good holiday' 'I hope the weather holds' 'Hope to see you soon' and so on. I use that word 'hope' so often; the same word for small things and also for enormous things 'I hope Russia stops bombing Ukraine', 'I hope we can reduce greenhouse gases'

What do we actually mean when we say 'I hope?' Is hope just wishful thinking which can feel rather pathetic, or is it a persistent cheery optimism which can be really irritating!? In the Bible, the writer Paul says: 'May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace by your faith in him, until by the power of the Holy Spirit, you overflow with hope' (Romans 15:13)

And the spirituality writer Christopher Chapman says hope is 'the creative, purposeful presence of God within 'what is' It is inspired vision and imagination. It is a verb as much as a feeling - 'I hope' as an action'

When we think of hope as action it can become something real and tangible. It is often borne out of great adversity and against the backdrop of a darkening world. Examples through history abound but here are a few: the beautiful playground and library built at the Southport Primary School whose two small girls were killed last year demonstrates hope in action. Another example is the orphaned children in World War 2 refugee camps who were traumatised by fear of starvation and were given a piece of bread to sleep with at night to remind them that they had eaten that day and would be able to eat again tomorrow - hope in action. Our own group of churches runs GrowBaby, a baby bank for children from 0-5 which is open monthly at Lynsted Church. The team of volunteers are able to gift, completely free of charge, clothing and nappies etc which have all been donated. Last month GrowBaby supported 30 families amongst whom there were some people in truly desperate need. Again, this is hope in action, looking at the needs of the most vulnerable people in our communities and bringing them good news.

Hope in action is often found on the margins of life, quietly bubbling away until it overflows into an unstoppable force for good. Hope in action formed the earthly ministry of Jesus and it remains Christ's call to every age. If we don't name ourselves as Christian or even as someone who is particularly hopeful, let's not forget that God has a history of using unlikely people and unlikely places to bring in the good news! The invitation and challenge to us in this darkening world is to nurture through faith, the flickering flame of hope in our hearts and to look for where we could share that light of hope as individuals and as communities of faith.





The Council continues to work with other Parish Councils to support our legal representatives and subject experts as they represent our views to the Inspector. Open Session

Cllr Steve Coates, Chair of Doddington Parish Council, provided an update on Highsted Park inquiry, which had been in recess over the summer period but was due to restart in October. So far the 5 parishes had raised in excess of £34,000 but with a barrister costing £1,500 a day, further funding was still required. Several fundraising events had been scheduled.

Highsted Park

It was proposed by Cllr Fray, seconded by Cllr Crampton and on being put to the meeting it was RESOLVED to donate a further £500 to the legal costs.

Meeting Time

It was agreed to keep the time of meetings to 7.30pm.

Future Projects

Several items were considered in brief, including a toddler play park, bench and village shop. Further discussion is required.

Outstanding Payments

A number of outstanding payments were noted due to the difficulty in accessing Unity Trust Bank

It was proposed by Cllr Crampton, seconded by Cllr Fray and on being put to the meeting it was **RESOLVED** to open an account with Lloyds Bank

Cllr Turner had attended a meeting on LGR hosted by Faversham Town Council, to consider the boundary of any future unitary and whether the village parishes felt more aligned with the east of the county, rather than the west.







Nature Notes

In the August newsletter, I wrote about the party of **Crossbills** that visited our Doddington garden. I have since learnt that there was a large movement of Crossbills into Britain this summer – what birders call an 'irruption'. Irruptions usually occur because of a lack of food in the species' usual range, and it is likely that a lack of Norway Spruce seeds (Crossbills' favourite food) in Northern Europe drove the mass movement of birds seen this summer.

Movement in the natural world is a constant, as species spread or retreat in response to environmental changes, or as a result of genetic or behavioural change. Often, people are involved in accidentally or deliberately moving species from one place to another. Sometimes, newly arrived species cause problems, and it is their stories that hit the headlines – such as the Yellow-legged (or Asian) Hornet that we read so much about. But such species are a tiny minority. There are no headlines for the Southern Oak Bush-cricket that came to Britain in 2001 and is now widespread and settled – I see it commonly around the village – or the large (7 to 8mm long) and colourful bug Rhyparochromus vulgaris (pictured right) that first arrived in 2010 and which I've seen on more than one occasion here this summer, or even for the beautiful Willow Emerald Damselflies (pictured below), first found in Britain in 1992 and now widespread and visiting garden ponds around our villages.



For the overwhelming majority of species that arrive here, the truth is that they settle in and become part of the scenery. Yes, they may have some impact, but in most cases they just add to natural diversity and – if they are noticed at all – often become a valued asset. Where would towns be without **Buddleia** (or **Butterfly-bush**) to attract butterflies? And look at how we mourn the loss of **Common Poppies**, **Cornflowers**, **Corn Margiold** and other cornfield weeds – all of these come from the Middle East and arrived as farming people migrated westward through Europe centuries ago.



Now, as climate change accelerates, we need species to move more than ever. Human action has led to the fastest warming of the planet for 10,000 years (and the evidence that humans are the driver of this heating is overwhelming). This means species must move or die. For us, here in Kent, it means that we need species to colonise from the near continent to replace those species that we are already losing as the weather gets hotter and drier – otherwise, we will just watch as the natural environment gets less and less diverse, interesting, and valuable.
