Message for the Month

Every autumn, many churches and schools across the UK fill tables with tins and fruit; they sing about gathering the crops and give thanks for what has been provided. Harvest Festival, with all its colour and comfort, remains one of the few church traditions that still connects our everyday lives with the land, each other and with God. While most of us no longer work the soil ourselves, many of us still find something deeply meaningful in this annual moment of gathering and celebration. A moment to say thank you, to replenish the food store, to give generously to others and to mark the turning of the seasons.

But in 2025, in a world shaped more by ideas, information and services than by physical sowing and reaping of crops, we in High Downs Parish have been asking ourselves a few questions and we'd love to hear your thoughts too:

Where does Harvest fit today? How do we align it to our current cultural climate and 'off the shelf' modern lifestyle? Apart from material sustenance, what might it offer as a 'spiritual food' or discipline, especially around stewardship, generosity and of gratitude?

In the New Testament, the concept of harvest often takes on a more spiritual dimension. Jesus speaks of the Kingdom of God as a field ready for harvest (Matthew 9:37), connecting the theme with the call to share the Gospel.

St. Paul encourages believers in Galatians 6 verse 9 "not to grow weary in doing good" and pointing to a future harvest of righteousness and reward for those who have sown wisely and steadfastly. He also uses harvest language to speak directly about financial generosity, urging the church to give freely and faithfully: "Whoever sows generously will also reap generously" (2 Corinthians 9:6).

So, while most of us no longer plant literal seeds, the pattern of sowing, tending, and reaping remains a deeply Christian rhythm. It is one that still speaks into our spiritual lives and needs, our relationships, and even our finances.

Harvest is a natural moment to give thanks for what has grown, it may be a time for spiritual and financial reflection, but it can also invite us to ask deeper questions: What am I investing in - this harvest to come? What kind of fruit am I hoping to see? What am I storing up for the future?

For those of us working in offices, caregiving, teaching, or tech, the agricultural imagery might feel distant. But the spiritual practice it reflects is timeless.

Harvest prompts us to pause, to reflect and to review. And, in our modern age, that might mean looking prayerfully at how we live our lives, our priorities, our financial habits, our patterns of generosity and most especially our dependence upon God who ultimately provides for us.

It reminds us that giving is often slow and unseen, deliberate work that requires faith, fortitude and patience. God sees the seeds we sow, even when the fruit is not yet visible, in our produce, productivity and in our good deeds.

Harvest is not just a tradition to be remembered. It's a rhythm that can shape our whole life; our hearts, our spirits in a way that helps us to review, recommit and reinvest in our rootedness with God and creation.





The link directs you to a realistic website under the control of the criminals, where they will look to steal your personal and financial data.

The DWP never send text messages or emails asking for your bank details for Winter Fuel Payment purposes.

If you receive a scam message:

- Do not click any links.
- Do not reply to the message.
- Do not share personal or payment details.

WHAT HAVE WE BEEN READING?

WHICH BOOK? – HOPE DIES LAST by Studs Terkel (2003)

WHAT'S IT ABOUT? – Studs Terkel was an American oral historian and radio presenter, and the book consists of individuals talking about living through the momentous periods of the 20th Century, including wars, the great depression, the civil rights movement, and more. Studs spoke to politicians, military men, union activists, prisoners, lawyers, priests and many more people, some well-known, like the singers Pete Seeger and Arlo Guthrie and the economist John Kenneth Galbraith, others not. The theme of the book is how to maintain hope – and to act – in the face of mounting authoritarianism, division, and inequality. Though more than 20 years old, it is a timely read at a time when decency, humanity, and compassion seem to be increasingly regarded as sins rather than virtues.
