Route Direction

This walk involves a bus ride from Faversham to the Sportsman pub between Graveney & Seasalter where the walk begins. The **660** bus stops at the **B** stop in Court Road (o/s Asks). It runs Mon - Fri with just 2 buses running; one at **10.15** am & the other at **1.20pm**. There is ample long-stay parking in Faversham.

- 1. Alight the bus at The Sportsman pub and take the steps to the RIGHT of the pub onto the raised bank. Turn LEFT and follow this grassy bank to a kissing gate into the South Swale local Nature reserve. Continue on as the bank curves RIGHT toward the sea wall.
- 2. Follow the seawall for approximately 11/2 miles (2.5k) passing through a number of kissing gates & illustrative information boards. The path is easy underfoot but can be muddy in parts. At the gate at this point there is a direction arrow indicating LEFT, down the embankment, onto the marshland. Also at this point there is a sign over the seawall advising no entry onto the Castle Coote bird sanctuary.
- 3. The decision now is to either turn LEFT, off the sea wall or continue to follow the path alongside the seawall which lengthens the walk by 1 ½ miles (2k). It is worth pointing out that the path across the marshland entails walking through what is to become the Cleve Hill Solar farm.
- 4. Turn LEFT, off the seawall, through a kissing gate where there is a sign that the footpath remains open but to be aware of heavy machinery crossing over

- the path. Go straight ahead crossing over the cinder track and follow the wide path between high wire fencing.
- 5. The path must be followed between the fencing where it leads under the power lines and continues toward Nagden Barn & cottages. The alternative seawall route rejoins the route here. Follow the lane past the buildings, through a gate where it rises up again onto a grassy bank beside the Faversham Creek.
- 6. At the junction of paths, turn RIGHT to follow the path above the Faversham Creek back toward Faversham passing through Iron Wharf. There is a small refreshment shed just the other side of the footbridge onto the wharf; Quint Retreat is worth a stop. Continue on to Standard Quay with its antique shops, tea rooms & the old barges moored alongside the quay.
- 7. At the end of the quay turn LEFT where the road bends round to the Anchor pub on the corner and after a few steps turn RIGHT onto Abbey Street. Continue to the end, cross over the road back to the bus stop.
