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The last time I wrote an article for the Newsletter I was announcing my marriage. What a wonderful occasion that was as was our church blessing in June.

One thing that usually (not always) happens is the woman changing her surname. I took my husband's surname and it has taken some getting used to. For most of my life I have been Ramshaw now I have to remember that I am McIntyre. Seven months later and I still have a nagging doubt that I have forgotten to tell someone my new surname. Remembered the bank, utilities, etc but for those organisations we don't contact that often it is difficult to tell everyone. Then a letter will arrive and it is still Ramshaw.

This made me think about my identity, although my name has changed and I am a married woman my identity hasn't changed, I am still me. But what is our identity how do we define ourselves? Identity is often spoken of as something we build — a mosaic of choices, memories, relationships, and roles. But through a religious lens, identity becomes something deeper: not merely constructed, but revealed. It is less a project and more a pilgrimage.

There is a quiet truth echoed across many traditions: before you become anything, you are already known. Jeremiah 1 verse 5 "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you;" Known by God, known by the Creator, known by the Source. How wonderful is that? Identity begins not with self-definition but with divine recognition.

In this view, your truest self is not the one shaped by expectation or achievement, but the one held gently in the mind of God — the self that existed before titles, before mistakes, before fear. This is the self that scripture often calls beloved.

Identity is not static; it is a calling that unfolds over time. Faith teaches that who you are is not confined to who you have been or what you have done. There is always a deeper layer waiting to be lived.

Sometimes this calling whispers. Sometimes it disrupts. Sometimes it asks you to step out of the familiar and into the unknown. But it always moves toward greater wholeness — toward becoming the person God already sees. Jeremiah 29 v11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Religious identity is not only about discovering who you are; it is also about releasing who you are not.

Letting go becomes a spiritual discipline.

Letting go of the identity shaped by fear.

Letting go of the identity shaped by comparison.

Letting go of the identity shaped by wounds that tried to define you.

In surrender, you make space for grace to do its quiet work.

Identity is never solitary. It is shaped in relationship — with God, with others, with creation. You are not an isolated soul wandering through meaning; you are part of a larger story. A wonderful story shaped by God.

We all have many identities parents, children, work colleagues, grandparents, church family we all wear different hats and our identity can change depending on who we are with self-esteem comes from being comfortable in who you are, being happy with who you are.

Your identity is woven into the prayers of those who came before you and the hopes of those who will come after. To know yourself is also to know your place in the tapestry of faith. Ultimately, identity is not a destination but a becoming.

A lifelong unfolding of the divine image within you.

You are not finished.

You are not fixed.

You are not defined by your lowest moment or your highest achievement. You are not defined by your acts, your name or what you wear.

You are a work of sacred art in progress — shaped by mercy, strengthened by struggle, illuminated by love.

Identity, in its deepest sense, is the meeting point between who you are, who you are becoming, and who God has always known you to be. It is a journey of revelation, courage, and grace.

Are you happy with your identity? no.... I can assure you that God is happy with you if you let him into your life to help shape you, guide you and live in you with peace and love.

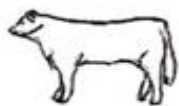

SHOPPER BUS

Councillors were pleased to learn that from September, the Shopper Bus will run from Doddington on Saturdays at 9.35am. 12.05pm and 14.10pm. Full details will be published on the website when available.

POLICE

PC Atherton attended the meeting and reported that nuisance motor cycles/E-bikes have been an issue across rural parts of the Borough. The police want members of the public to report incidents and any information regarding the make, partial registration numbers, description of rider (distinctive clothing etc - if possible), linked vehicles eg vans, time of incident, location etc in order for them to gather an intelligence picture. PLANNING MATTERS

i. Proposed Highsted Park Ref: 21/503914/EIOUT Location: Land South And East Of Sittingbourne Kent Ref: 21/503906/EIOUT Location: Land To The West Of Teynham London Road Teynham The Inquiry Chair's report has now been submitted to the Secretary of State. The final decision is expected in September.

ii. Ref: 26/501794/FULL: The Oast Driving Range Church Road Tonge Kent ME9 9AR.

The proposals seek to improve the existing facilities through the import of around 40,000m³ soil to raise the ground level of the existing golf course in line with the driving range and wider site, and subsequent rebuild. This will result in soil being transported by up to 50 HGVs per day from collection sites to Tonge. Doddington PC is not a statutory consultee in respect of this application. However, we have submitted comments relating to the transport management plan which reflect our past experience with tipper trucks collecting soil from the vicinity of Lenham to the golf course and the disruption this caused. Should the application be permitted, Doddington, Wichling and Lynsted would only be affected if the route from Lenham was repeated. The council will monitor this.

HIGHWAYS

The Parish Council has chased Swale Borough Council (SBC) regarding the stage 2 complaint lodged on 1 June concerning the failure to carry out the road sweep on the Old Lenham Road when requested on 5 November 2025. They have apologised and the complaint is on hold pending further investigations.

Doddington Village Fete – Sunday 30 August, 1pm to 4pm

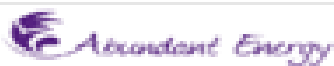

At its meeting on 16 July 2026, Newnham Parish Council considered a number of matters affecting the parish.

The Council approved the minutes of the previous meeting held on 11 June 2026 before receiving updates during the open session. Members were pleased to note that the village defibrillator is fully operational, and thanks were recorded to the Newnham Fete Committee for their continued support within the community. The Council also received an update on the outcome of the Local Government Reorganisation, noting that Option 4B had been decided.

The Council discussed the introduction of a Community Speedwatch scheme. While contact is still awaited from Kent Police, it was agreed that the Council will begin advertising for local volunteers interested in helping with the initiative.

In financial matters, councillors approved a payment of £118.80 to PlaySafety for an inspection report on the outdoor gym equipment. The report will be considered in detail at the next meeting to determine any actions that may be required.

Members also discussed the future of The George Inn. The Council resolved to write to Shepherd Neame, urging the company to reopen the pub at the earliest opportunity. Councillors agreed to await a response before considering whether to pursue registration of the building as an Asset of Community Value.

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INFINITI PUPILS AT THE FURNACE ROOM STUDIO

Christine Adams & Andy Glen

On a Thursday morning in June I had the pleasure of visiting Andy Glen's Furnace Rooms Studios with 3 students from Infiniti School. I have been visiting the school once a week for a while offering music sessions. Sometimes the youngsters want to learn a certain instrument but most often they want to explore their favourite songs or tracks from games and films. Summer, Kyle and Gracie have been keen on singing in these sessions for the last few weeks and I contacted Andy to see if we could visit the studio. He was delighted and keen to help the students in their musical journeys.

They had prepared songs to record and knew their material well. Of course there were nerves and excitement as they did not know quite what to expect!

Andy put the students at their ease showing them around the studio and answering all their questions. There were all sorts of responses; the phrase "the dead room" needed some explanation! And there was astonishment at the number of instruments and all the equipment.

Summer and Kyle sang their version of Shallow and after three takes began to relax and enjoy themselves. As they did so we saw a change both in their stance and in the quality of their voices. Gracie sang Lost Boy and in three takes grew in confidence. There followed the recording of Dancing on My Own with Summer and Kyle well into their stride by now. All three singers had already achieved a great deal. And then we revisited Shallow and Andy invited Kyle to sing the harmony part for one section of the song. It was a huge ask to sing new material there and then, and Andy's skill as a mentor as well as a producer did the trick. After a few tries Kyle nailed it. There was never any doubt that all three students would do well in the session – we knew they would and by the end of the morning they believed it too!

The morning ended with Andy kindly leading a jam session before the students returned to school for afternoon classes. What a great morning!

Christine

I was indeed delighted to receive the call from Christine about having the students from the Infiniti School over to the studio to record for the morning. As an educator myself at Ashford College where I teach cohorts of 16-19 years, I was well aware of the pitfalls, nerves and anxiety young adults face when they come in to a studio environment for the first time.

All three students however came equipped with curiosity and a great deal of courage. It's very exposing to sing in front of someone you've never met before, let alone have it committed to a recording, but the students were well rehearsed and found their footing fairly quickly.

I decided to set up for the vocal sessions with me in the control room so we had an inclusive intimate working setting. It can be quite daunting for singers, especially for those who it was their first time of being in a recording studio to be sent out into a live room with just a microphone and a set of headphones to guide them, so hopefully the students felt supported and at ease with having others around. Naturally there were lots of questions about what would happen if they 'messed up' to which I simply said that we would 'delete it and do it again'.

Each of the singers had real individual character to their voices. Kyle, a natural baritone, Summer, a well-grounded alto, and Gracy, a light agile mezzo-soprano. All the students took direction really well and responded to feedback with grace while I tried to get the best performance out of them. The star student of the day for me was Kyle who showed real courage and risk taking. He took on some of the parts that others didn't feel confident enough to attempt on the day, and adapted well when I asked him to drop the pitch of Dancing on my Own, which was a huge accomplishment and showed great resilience.

I was very proud of all three students and was grateful to Christine for allowing me to have the opportunity to be part of their footprint in starting out on their music journeys into recording.

I wish them all well and hope to be able to record them again at some point in the future. Well done guys, you nailed it!

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Notes from WDN History Group – Scribblings and scratchings

There's an excellent write up by Jacqueline Spencer in the Faversham Society's August newsletter about recent work on the Doddington Parochial Library. If you're not familiar with the library, it consists of about 350 books collected by Daniel Somerscales, a vicar of Doddington and established as a parochial library in 1744. It is now kept at Faversham Town Council's offices in the Market Place where it can be viewed by appointment. Volunteers have been looking at the collection for any writing added to the books. A third have names signed in them, although only nine by Daniel Somerscales. But their best finds to date is a large drawing of a man wearing Puritan-style clothing (shoes with buckles and a Puritan 'capotain' hat) and sporting a goatee beard. Possibly drawn by a bored student reading this 17th century book entitled 'The Essence of Universal Secular History'. And written in Latin by the drawing was 'Ioannus Sleidanus assinus est', that's 'Johann Sleidan is an ass'. Sleidan was a 16th century historian, presumably quoted in the book!

The history group have looked at the less cultured, but equally entertaining writing and doodles scratched into the pews in Newnham Church of which there's a lot! There are initials, names, declarations of love, dates (earliest seen 1891), boats, aeroplanes, sailors, ploughs, horses, robots, a snowman, cyclists, and cowboys. If these were made by bored children during church services, it's hard to believe that the scratching wasn't heard by the vicar!



Nature Notes

Making your own compost isn't just good for the garden, it can be good for wildlife too. When you pile up green garden waste, a whole series of bacteria, fungi and invertebrates move in and start breaking it down, and they are quickly followed by the various insects and spiders that eat them. Woodlice are often found in compost heaps, especially if it's a bit dry, and there can be several species (you can buy a low-cost guide to woodlice here: <https://www.field-studies-council.org/shop/publications/woodlouse-name-trail/>). There are specialist beetles, including the long, slender, predatory rove beetles (this beetle family has more than 1,000 species in the UK!), as well as mites, spiders, worms and much more.

Amongst the less familiar compost-heap residents are some species of Pseudoscorpions, which are arachnids, having eight legs (like their relatives the spiders). They have enlarged front appendages which give them the appearance of scorpions, but they are harmless to people and also tiny – the biggest British species is just over 4mm long. The picture on the right shows a pseudoscorpion, no more than 2mm long, that I found in our compost heap at Doddington Allotments. Being tiny, Pseudoscorpions need help getting around, and one way they do it is by grabbing onto larger flies and beetles with those big claws and hitching a lift through the air.



We are all familiar with the Common Earwig, but it has a relative that is a specialist dweller in compost and dung heaps. The Lesser Earwig gets up to 7mm (less than one-third of an inch) and is rarely seen. The earwig in the picture is a male Lesser Earwig from the same compost heap as the Pseudoscorpion. Unlike the Pseudoscorpions, Lesser Earwigs can fly, having fan-like wings which are carefully folded away when they land.

Reaching for the Weedkiller? It Affects More Than You Think

When weeds appear between paving stones, insects start nibbling our plants, or our garden doesn't look quite as tidy as we'd like, it's tempting to reach for a quick fix. Herbicides (weedkillers) and pesticides can seem like an easy solution - spray, wait, and the problem disappears.

But what we put on our gardens doesn't always stay where we put it. These chemicals can affect the wider environment, including the insects, birds, pets, wildlife and soil that all play an important role in keeping our gardens healthy.

Many of the creatures we think of as "bugs" are actually helping us. Bees, butterflies, beetles and other insects pollinate plants and provide food for birds and other wildlife. When insect numbers decline, it can have a knock-on effect throughout the ecosystem.

Herbicides can also affect the soil beneath our feet. Healthy soil is full of tiny organisms, fungi and bacteria that help plants grow and support a thriving garden. Using chemicals unnecessarily can disturb this natural balance.

This doesn't mean our gardens need to be perfectly wild or untidy. A few "weeds", however, are not always a bad thing. Dandelions, clover and other flowering plants provide valuable food for pollinators, while a lawn that is allowed to flower occasionally can support much more wildlife than a completely weed-free one.

The good news is that there are plenty of alternatives:

For weeds:

- Pull them by hand when the soil is damp.
- Use a hoe regularly to remove young weeds before they spread.
- Add mulch, compost or woodchip around plants to reduce weed growth.
- Plant ground-cover plants that leave less space for weeds to establish.

For pests:

- Encourage natural predators such as ladybirds, frogs and birds.
- Use nematodes or beneficial insects to boost numbers of predators.
- Grow a variety of plants to create a balanced garden.
- Remember that a few nibbled leaves are a normal part of nature.

For healthier plants:

- Feed the soil with compost and organic matter.
- Choose plants suited to your garden conditions.
- Water deeply and less often to encourage strong roots.

We don't need everyone to change everything overnight. Small choices made by many people can create a big difference. Leaving a small wild patch, planting a few pollinator-friendly flowers, or choosing not to spray can all help.

A beautiful garden doesn't have to be a perfect garden. Sometimes a little messiness is exactly what nature need

WHAT HAVE WE BEEN READING?

WHICH BOOK? – *BLACK NARCISSUS* (Rumer Godden, 1939) and *REBECCA* (Daphne du Maurier 1938)

WHAT ARE THEY ABOUT? – Obsession, jealousy, fear, and haunting! Very different plots, locations, and people but the underlying themes are common to both. The buildings and locations in both stories disturb the characters; an isolated Himalayan mountain palace for the English nuns in *Black Narcissus* and the Cornish estate Manderley, which the second, young wife of Mr de Winters moves to, in *Rebecca*. This on top of some pernicious characters; the local agent Mr Dean (*Black Narcissus*), and Mrs Danvers (*Rebecca*) cause even more emotional distress.

WERE THEY ON THE MOBILE LIBRARY? – No, I ordered them both and they arrived very quickly.

Both books were made into award-winning films in the 1940s and are now regarded as classics. *Black Narcissus* was directed by Michael Powell and Emeric Pressburger, and *Rebecca* by Alfred Hitchcock.
